

ENABLE Scotland's money 2018 - 2019



In the last year ENABLE Scotland received £39.0 million pounds, and ENABLE Scotland spent £39.1 million pounds.

More money received



ENABLE Scotland received £4.1 million more in the last year than in the year before.



This is because local councils gave ENABLE Scotland more money to support more people.



We raised more money from fundraising and donations from companies too.

ENABLE Scotland also received more from people who wanted to donate some of their money to the charity when they died.

An equal society for every person who has a learning disability

More money spent

ENABLE Scotland spent £4.6 million more in the last year than in the year before.



This meant in the last year, ENABLE Scotland spent slightly more money than it received.

There was a very good reason for this.



A lot of local councils did not give us enough money to pay the Scottish Living Wage for overnight support.



But ENABLE Scotland decided to spend £315,000 of the charity's money to pay all our Personal Assistants (our PAs) the Scottish Living Wage for every hour worked from 1st January 2019.

This meant the charity spent £87,000 more than it received.



We thought this was the right thing to do.

Looking after the charity's money



At ENABLE Scotland, we are always careful to keep our costs low and make sure our spending helps the charity to do more for the people we support.

Our charity partnership with Sense Scotland – called The Piper Group – helped us spend less on big technology projects that we needed to buy.
