

ENABLE Scotland's money 2019 - 2020



In the last year ENABLE Scotland received £43.89 million pounds, and ENABLE Scotland spent £43.87 million pounds.

More money received



ENABLE Scotland received £4.8 million more in the last year than in the year before.



This is because local councils gave ENABLE Scotland more money to support more people.



We raised more money from fundraising events too.

More money spent



ENABLE Scotland spent £4.7 million more in the last year than in the year before.

This meant in the last year, ENABLE Scotland brought in slightly more money than it spent. This is called a surplus.



It's good to have a surplus because this helps make sure the charity is strong and can keep helping people.



Last year, ENABLE Scotland made a surplus of £17,000.



We paid all our Personal Assistants (our PAs) at least the Scottish Living Wage for every hour worked – including overnight support – throughout the whole year, and we spent an extra £237,000 to recruit and retain staff in some of our more complex services.

Our surplus would have been higher if we didn't do this, but we believe it is the right thing to do.

Looking after the charity's money



At ENABLE Scotland, we are always careful to keep our costs low and make sure our spending helps the charity to do more for the people we support.

We spent a lot of money on new technology last year.



We spent £360,000 to give all our staff smartphones. This helped us to have a digitally enabled and connected workforce.



In the previous year (2018/19), we had invested £400,000 in technology which meant we were able to support most of our staff to work remotely during the coronavirus pandemic. We feel this was money well spent.
