

ENABLE Scotland's money 2020 - 2021



In the last year ENABLE Scotland received £48.2 million, and ENABLE Scotland spent £47.4 million.

More money received



ENABLE Scotland received £4.4 million more in the last year than in the year before.



This is because local councils gave ENABLE Scotland more money to support the people we work for.



We also raised two and a half times more money in grants from funders for our charitable services than we received the year before.

Spending money and having a surplus



ENABLE Scotland spent £3.5 million more in the last year than in the year before.

Overall in the last year, ENABLE Scotland brought in more money than it spent. This is called a surplus.



It's good to have a surplus because this helps make sure the charity is strong and can keep helping people.



Last year, ENABLE Scotland made a surplus of £858,000, which meant an end of year surplus for ENABLE Group of £730,000.

We paid all our Personal Assistants (PAs) at least the Scottish Living Wage for every hour worked – including overnight support – throughout the whole year.



We were officially recognised as a Living Wage Employer because of our commitment to good pay for our staff.

Looking after the charity's money



At ENABLE Scotland, we are always careful to keep our costs low and make sure our spending helps the charity to do more for the people we support.



We do this by concentrating on our:

- Cash
- Customers
- Co-workers
- Collaboration



Because of the coronavirus pandemic, we spent six times less money on fundraising and events than in the year before.



We also spent less than half as much on travel as we did the year before.



We used Government funds like the furlough scheme where this was the right thing to do.



Money we had already spent on technology meant we were able to support most of our staff to work remotely during the coronavirus pandemic. We feel this was money well spent.
